- ✓ Do I breach this or any of its supporting Traditions in subtle, perhaps unconscious ways?

District 48 Grapevine Representative (GVR)



A little history on the Grapevine (Gv), the meeting in print was created by four women and two men and the first issue was printed in June 1944. The description under the headed was put in place by the fourth issue and reads as:

A monthly Journal devoted to those seeking further knowledge on the problem of alcoholism, in the hope that it may prove a unifying bond to all alcoholics everywhere. Individual opinions expressed here are not, necessarily, those of AA as a whole.

Some other basics facts about the Gv, is it does not receive any contributions made to General Service, it strives to be self-supporting through the sales of the magazine and it related items. Every article ever written is available online. The AA Grapevine, Inc is one of the two operating entities of the General Service Board, with its own staff and financial operation separate from GSO.

As the Grapevine Representative (Gv) your basic job is to make the Gv available to the groups and encourage AAs to read it. When you register with the Gv office you will receive a Gv kit that includes a handbook to welcome you to the Gv network, informational guidelines, flyers, and order forms.

The Steps, the Traditions, the Preamble and the Serenity Prayer appear in every issue. In addition, to regular stories about working the Steps and using the Traditions; Emotional Sobriety; Spiritual Awakenings; Newcomers; Sponsorship; and Into Action.

To be honest, I myself feel a lot is not known about what the GV Representative (GVR) does. The GVR can be asked by any group or meeting to come and read from the Gv. They need to show up and make the Gv available at all District workshops. Also to make sure that each group has a subscription to the Gv (I will try to work on that). I have enjoyed being the GVR, it is a way to stay involved and be held accountable but always remembering to "Keep It Simple". (All taken from the Gv Handbook.)
