## **OUR THREE LEGACIES**

**Step 9** – "Made direct amends to such people wherever possible, except when to do so would injure them or others."

<u>Tradition 9 - "A.A., as such, ought never be organized; but we may create service boards or committees directly</u> responsible to those they serve"

<u>Concept 9 – "Good service leadership at all levels is indispensable for our future functioning and safety. Primary world service leadership, once exercised by the founders, must necessarily be assumed by the trustees."</u>

#### TRADITIONS CHECKLIST

<u>Tradition Nine:</u> AA, as such, ought never be organized; but we may create service boards or committees directly responsible to those they serve.

- 1. Do I still try to boss things in AA?
- 2. Do I resist formal aspects of AA because I fear them as authoritative?
- 3. Am I mature enough to understand and use all elements of the AA program-even if no one makes me do so-with a sense of personal responsibility?
- 4. Do I exercise patience and humility in any AA job I take?
- 5. Am I aware of all those to whom I am responsible in any AA job?
- 6. Why doesn't every AA group need a constitution and bylaws?
- 7. Have I learned to step out of an AA job gracefully-and profit thereby-when the time comes?
- 8. What has rotation to do with anonymity? With humility?
